### **Early Start Denver Model (ESDM) videos of Sensory Social Routines (SSRs)**

This video is not posted as an example of ESDM but it actually shows how to set up a joint activity routine, be face to face with your child, and teach during play.

Non example of ESDM – This video is posted on Youtube as an ESDM video. Interaction with the child begins at 4.5 minutes. It is not clarified whether the child has ASD or is typical. This is not an example of ESDM because routines are not developed. The adult simply asks many questions. The adult is always leading and this isn't a shared activity with the adult and child co-creating a play theme. In order to be an example of ESDM the child and adult should be equal partners with the adult sometimes leading and sometimes following and the child sometimes leading and sometimes following.

### **ABA videos to contrast with ESDM**

Table discrete trial teaching at the Carbone clinic. Good example of mixing and varying, interspersing, prompting and error correction, and teaching at a high rate.

NET – Natural Environment Teaching at Carbone Clinic. This is a good example of NET teaching. Notice that it differs from Early Start Denver Model (ESDM) in that although the teacher has begun an activity she knows the child likes, the teacher is directing everything. In ESDM you aim to be an equal partner; the child leads and the teacher follows, in addition to the teacher leading and the child following.
